The Junior Class have been learning how to create different colour tones by adding white to their paint colour. When creating a tonal spiral, they experimented with blending colours which required appropriate brush control. Students have also enjoyed following some 'how to draw' tutorials and chose to draw a turtle to add to their tonal painting. These look great!
