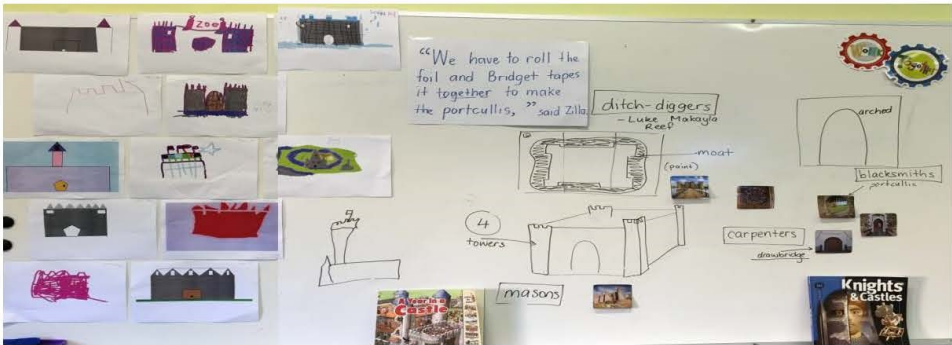


## Junior Class

### Learning Adventures

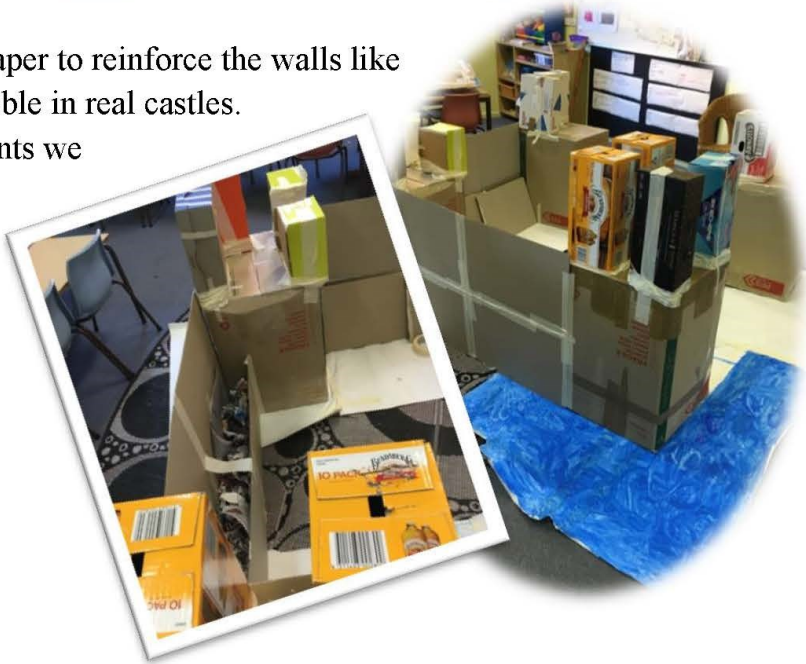
L3 Literacy sessions involve students in a variety of planned learning experiences including independent work, small group tasks and explicit teaching/learning sessions with the teacher.

The Junior Class Team is learning about Knights and Castles this Term. Each week we share a new book following our theme. We began by learning about the social structure of medieval times and we were introduced to some of the activities that commonly occurred in and around medieval castles. This was followed by learning about the importance of castles for securing land for those in power, and the function of their most common features. We used the Paint Program on the computer to design symmetrical castles which would inspire a recycled-material castle construction.



We have even used scrunched newspaper to reinforce the walls like the masons would have done with rubble in real castles. After teams built individual components we came together to bring our castle to life.

Throughout the construction we have been developing a variety of Literacy and Maths skills as we work cooperatively, sharing materials and solving design and construction dilemmas.

# BE A GOOD SORT

## THE DIRTY DOZEN

12 RECYCLING RULES FOR YOUR YELLOW BIN



RULE 1



### BAG THE BAG

You can recycle all soft plastic packaging including plastic bags, clean cling wrap, frozen veggie bags, pasta and biscuit packets etc. Place it all in a bag, tie it up and put it in your recycling bin.

RULE 2



### BROKEN GLASS & CROCKERY OK

Pyrex, drinking glasses, crockery and window glass are now accepted in your recycling bin along with glass bottles and jars. No windscreens please.

RULE 3



### NO STRINGS ATTACHED

String, rope and electrical cable can become tangled around the MRF machinery, hindering the recycling process. Please do not place these items in your recycling bin.

RULE 4



### NO NEED TO WASH

Recyclable containers need to be empty and free of food but they don't need to be washed. Save time and elbow grease.

RULE 5



### CLEAN POLYSTYRENE

Clean, white polystyrene can now be placed in your recycling bin. Put it in a plastic bag and tie it up. Please no bean bag beans.

RULE 6



### LEAVE THE LABEL

The labels on bottles and containers wash off during the recycling process. There is no need to remove them.

RULE 7



### KEEP IT LOOSE

Place recyclables into the bin loose not stacked inside one another or in plastic bags. (This excludes polystyrene and soft plastics.)

RULE 8



### HARDEN UP

You can place all hard plastics in your recycling bin regardless of whether they display the triangle or not. This includes plastic tableware, toys and plant pots.

RULE 9



### GRAB A SATCHEL

Grab a Resource Recovery Collection Satchel for household batteries, reading glasses, corks, X-rays, CDs and DVDs, mobile phones and accessories, printer cartridges, small electronics, electrical cords and smoke alarms.

RULE 10



### NO FOOD PLEASE

Food and food-spilled paper and cardboard items such as pizza boxes and paper towel do not belong in your recycling bin. Please put these items in your green organics bin.

RULE 11



### PUT A LID ON IT

You can now leave the lids on all your recyclables. Put the lids back on your plastic bottles and containers, glass jars and bottles (including twist tops) and put them in your recycling bin.

RULE 12



### EVERY LITTLE BIT COUNTS

Place all small plastics such as bread tags and straws in an empty milk bottle, put the lid on and place in your recycling bin. They are too small for the MRF machinery to remove on their own but are still a valuable resource.
