Principal's Message

Hi everyone,

Performance week is upon us and the excitement around our LPAF dance is ramping up. The dress rehearsal last week was very successful. It was amazing to see the difference in the level of enthusiasm and the quality of the dance moves performed simply by adding a special costume. Thank you to all families for taking the time to put together the costume items. The Eureka team can't wait for you to see our performance on stage.

At this week's rehearsals at Whitebrook Theatre, students were shown the meeting point where they can be dropped off / collected from Eureka Public School staff on the night. A map

Lismore Performing Arts Festival Update

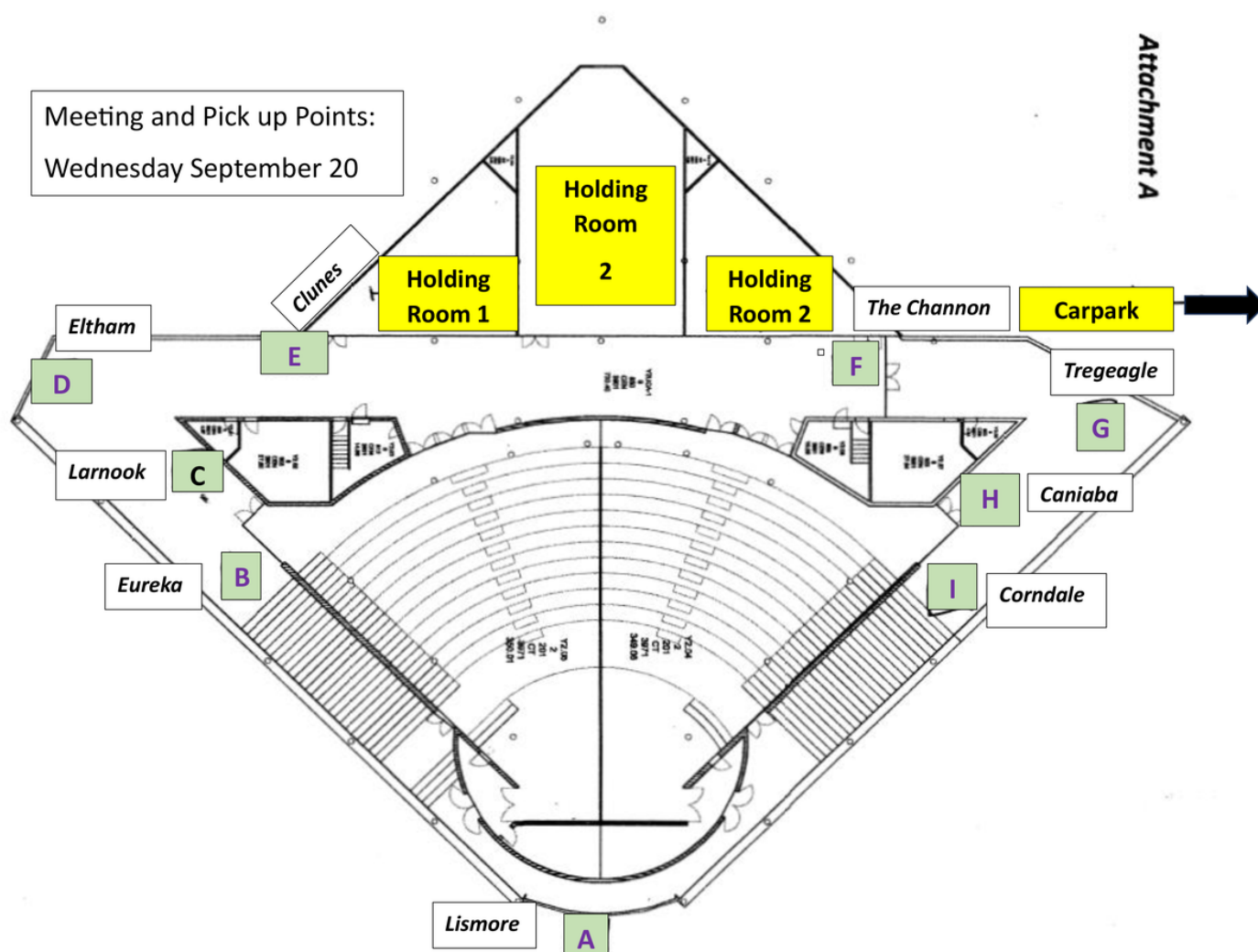

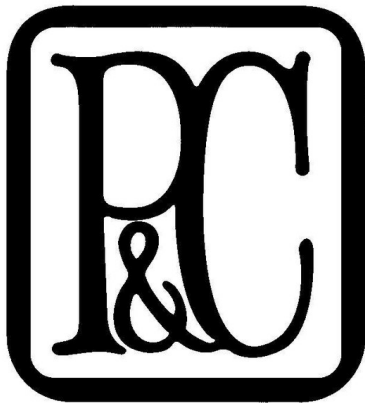
P&C

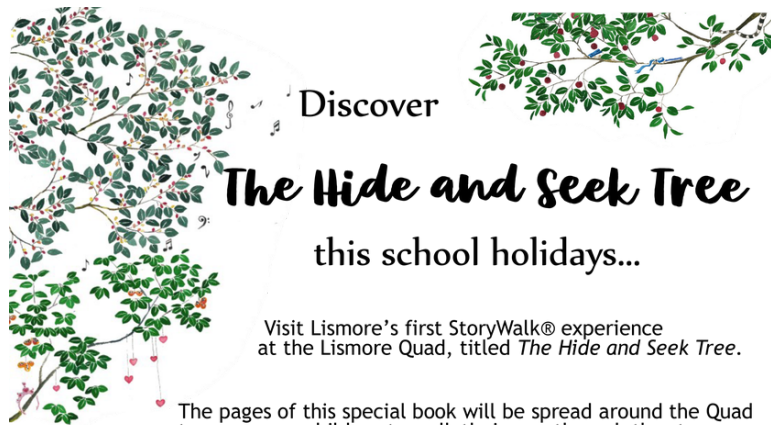
